

'How to' make liquid comfrey feed



One way of using comfrey is to make a rich organic fertiliser for your flowering and fruiting plants.



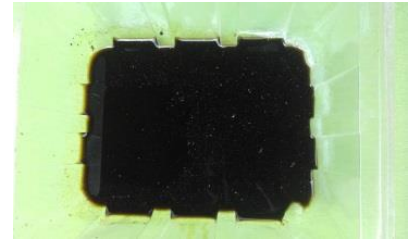
- You will need:
- Bucket or container with a lid
 - Gloves
 - Secateurs or scissors
 - A garden shears
 - Comfrey leaves



Cut the comfrey at the base of the stem, wear gloves as comfrey has scratchy hairs on the leaves. Add the leaves to the container and chop them up.



Cover the container and leave it in a shady corner for 3 – 5 weeks to decompose.



Pour the thick black liquid, rich in potassium into a container. Compost what is left. Dilute this fertiliser one part with 20 parts of water. Water directly onto the roots or spray the plants leaves.
